

Data Protection

What you need to know....

Personal data is information relating to a living person, who can be identified directly (or indirectly, in combination with other information) from the information in question.

When processing personal data, you must comply with these principles:

Lawful, Fair & Transparent

Personal data must be processed lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner in relation to the individual/s it relates to.

Security

Personal data must be processed in manner that ensures its confidentiality, including protection against unauthorised use and against accidential loss or destruction

Storage Limitation

Personal data must only be kept in a form which allows identification of the individual/s for no longer than is necessary for the purpose the personal data are processed.

Purpose Limitation

Personal data must be collected for specific, explicit and legitimate purposes, and not further processed in a manner that is incompatible with those purposes.

Data Minimisation

Personal data must adequate, relevant and limited to only what is necessary for the purpose they are processed.

Accuracy

Personal data must be accurate and, where necessary, kept up to date.
