## 1) How to identify Freedom of Information (FOI) requests:

- Any request for information held by a public authority (such as the MoJ) is a FOI request.
- A request does not need to quote the legislation to be a valid FOI enquiry
- "Held" information is that which is recorded by the public authority in any form: paper file, digital record, audio or video, email, "instant message", or work text.
- Any individual or organisation can make an FOI request, (but not another public authority).
- MoJ held information does not include data we hold solely on behalf on someone else.

## More information:

- A request for an opinion, an interpretation of policy or for advice is not a valid FOI
  request; unless any such opinion or interpretation is itself held in any form.
- A public authority is not required to create information to answer an FOI.
- However, already held "building blocks" can be used to provide the information requested; for example, carrying out straightforward calculations, or filtering information from an existing data set, to provide the requested information.
- All FOI requests should be forwarded as soon as possible to the Disclosure Team for logging and assignment.- <a href="mailto:data.access@justice.gov.uk">data.access@justice.gov.uk</a>

## 2) How to identify subject access requests (SARs):

- Any individual (data subject) can request access to their own information held by an organisation (such as the MoJ).
- A data subject does not have to quote the legislation, as long it is clear s/he is asking for their personal data.
- A third party can make such a request on behalf of the individual providing there is explicit and specific written consent from the data subject.
- SARs only relate to living individuals.
- · Appropriate proof of identification is required
